Resolution for Camping/Camper/Trailer Violations and Fine

97-05-02

Resolution Approval Date: May 10, 1997

Any owner camping on a vacant lot must obtain written approval (Trailer Permit) from the Architectural & Zoning Committee.

A trailer (or motor home) that meets Glenhaven Lakes Club, Whatcom County Health Department and Whatcom County Planning & Development standards is the only structure that can be used for overnight stays (camping).

(Trailer must be self contained for all water use within the structure or must be connected to an approved septic system.)

The owner will be notified in writing of any violation and a fine of \$ 25 per day will be levied starting the first day of the violation and until the violation is resolved (camper is gone).

Any trailer left on a vacant lot longer than the trailer permit allows will be fined \$25 per day beginning the tirst day of the violation and until the violation is resolved (trailer is gone).

The owner will be notified of the violation

If fines are not paid within 60 days, a lien will be placed against the owners property.

The fine will be continued and enforced until the camping activity ends and/or the trailer is removed.
